<p>North Gauhati College is a prominent institution dedicated to higher education, emphasizing the empowerment of first-generation and underprivileged students to become responsible citizens. To help these students reach their full potential, the college has expanded its offerings beyond traditional undergraduate programs in the arts and sciences. In 2015, it launched a B.Voc program</p>	

that includes innovative courses in Tourism and Hospitality Management as well as Beauty and Aesthetics. The college has marked significant achievements, such as signing Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with Guwahati IIT, two other universities, and an international MoU with Uma Global in New York. It has also established partnerships with various colleges across Assam to promote academic collaboration and enhance faculty and student development. In alignment with its founding vision, North Gauhati College is committed to excellence in teaching, learning, evaluation, innovation, research, and community engagement. Its academic programs are designed to be holistic and multidisciplinary, blending traditional courses with supplementary and innovative offerings. The college currently offers a diverse range of undergraduate programs, certificate courses, add-on programs, and diploma courses. Since the implementation of the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2019 and the adoption of the National Educational Policy (NEP-2020), students benefit from flexible options, including a wide selection of subjects in both science and arts, as well as general and honors courses. They can also choose from Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE) within the CBCS framework. Various departments offer certificate courses, aligning with the goal of enhancing the current educational landscape in collaboration with its affiliating university.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

North Gauhati College is affiliated with Gauhati University, which means that the credits earned by students are recognized according to the university's regulations. The university is also registered with the National Academic Depository (NAD), ensuring the credibility and verifiability of academic records.

17.Skill development:

To enhance skill-based education, North Gauhati College plans to introduce new skill-based certificate and value-added courses, benefiting both students and the local community. The college is currently offering several skill enhancement courses under the CBCS system and NEP -20202 and is looking to integrate its existing B.Voc programs with mainstream courses to further enrich the curriculum. Additionally, the college has signed MoUs with Yuva Bikash Kendra, Amingaon, Kamrup (a local registered NGO), and MIMs Institute, Guwahati, Assam. These collaborations are aimed at promoting a range of skill-related certificate courses to boost the skills of students and community members alike.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

North Gauhati College has established the Centre for Ancient Knowledge System with the objective of consolidating and preserving the indigenous knowledge of the region. This centre is dedicated to safeguarding the cultural heritage of North Guwahati and its surrounding areas while disseminating this knowledge among students. The centre focuses on gathering and documenting information about local cultures and practices, as well as curating cultural artifacts that reflect the richness and uniqueness of the region. It adopts an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approach, engaging with indigenous knowledge from socio-political, anthropological, zoo-botanical, economic, historical, geographical, geological, linguistic, and literary perspectives. To achieve its objectives, the Centre undertakes several initiatives, including: Organizing study tours for students to historically, religiously, and ecologically significant sites, such as places of biodiversity, museums, and libraries, to deepen their understanding of indigenous knowledge. Hosting cultural events, competitions, and exhibitions that provide a platform to showcase local artifacts, including traditional attires, cuisines, and musical instruments. Encouraging students to engage in local art forms, such as folk music, folk dance, culinary traditions, and literary activities. Facilitating participatory academic activities, such as report writing, project development, and audio-visual presentations, where students document and analyze indigenous knowledge. Promoting awareness and popularizing indigenous knowledge through digital and social media platforms. Utilizing Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) regulations, such as GI patents and copyright laws, to safeguard indigenous cultures, knowledge, and artifacts. Collaborating with the Anundoram Borooah Institute of Language, Art & Culture (ABILAC)—a leading institution focused on local knowledge systems—to undertake joint research and cultural initiatives. Through these activities, the Centre for Ancient Knowledge System aims to preserve, study, and promote the invaluable indigenous heritage of the region.

Regarding the focus on outcome based education, the faculties of the college has taken utmost care to fulfil all the requirements of the students. The teachers of the College have developed various teaching learning contents such as PPT files, Videos, PDF notes, etc., which are available in the college website and can be accessed by the students as per their convenient time and

space. Students are taken for field visits to gain first-hand experience and practical knowledge. Hands-on training, practical sessions, workshops, popular/motivational talks, webinars/seminars, etc. on various topics are organized by the various departments from time to time to achieve the intended learning

20.Distance education/online education:

North Gauhati College hosts a Distance Education Study Centre under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU). Known as the Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University Study Centre, North Gauhati College, this centre offers a wide range of postgraduate and undergraduate degree programs, along with diploma and certificate courses across various disciplines. In addition to these programs, the centre provides a dual degree option, allowing regular students of the college to simultaneously pursue a program from KKHSOU, provided they meet the necessary qualifications. The programs offered under KKHSOU include: Master of Arts (MA) in Assamese, Political Science, Education, and English. Postgraduate Diploma in Library and Information Science. Bachelor of Arts (BA) program. Students can pursue a BA with Major Indian Language (Assamese or Alternative English), English, Political Science, Education, Economics, and History through distance mode under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University.

North Gauhati College follows the curriculum provided by the Gauhati university. The routine committee prepares a routine both regular and tutorial classes. For ensuring effective delivery and transaction of the curriculum, lecture method, question answer method etc. are used to discuss the theoretical portion of each subject. Laboratories are used to conduct the practical portion of the syllabus. Co-curricular activities are also given equal importance for the wholesome development of students. Students are also encouraged to participate in NCC and NSS programmes which help them to develop their leadership qualities. Vocational educational programs like certificate courses for basic computer, technician courses etc. are also offered by the college. The faculties of the college are encouraged to participate in Faculty Development programmes for enhancing the teaching-learning process, keeping abreast of the latest academic trends and doing justice to the curriculum. Contractual and guest lecturers are appointed for the timely completion of the syllabus. Identifying the slow and advanced learners, departments take measurable steps to meet their needs. Mentoring system is also available in the college. Continuous assessment of students through class tests, mid-term tests and surprise tests are done by the departments. Extension activities are regularly organised for upliftment of the students.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

North Gauhati College follows the academic calendar of Gauhati University, which is the college's affiliating university. Final examinations for all the semesters are conducted in accordance with the routine issued by the affiliating university. The sessional examinations of all the Honours Courses are conducted by

the respective departments, and all the Regular/Honours generic Courses, compulsory and elective subjects like General English are conducted by the Examination Cell of the college. The sessional examinations are designed and implemented by the heads of the various departments, in consultation with the other faculties of the college. In order to induce sustained development of the students, the college follows methods for continuous evaluation. The departments are at liberty to devise and maintain their own strategies for the continuous evaluation of their students. In order to be eligible for appearing in the Sessional Examinations of a given subject/paper, it is mandatory for students to attend a minimum of 75 percent of the total classes held in that particular subject/paper during the semester. Class tests, home assignments, group discussions, presentations, and viva-voce are also held from time to time in order to keep students within the radar of CIE.

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

The issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability are included into the Curriculum.

Professional Ethics: Some papers in the subjects of English and Education focus on issues related to professional ethics. Issues of plagiarism are also addressed in some papers.

Gender: Issues pertaining to gender disparity are well represented in select courses of Education and Political Science. Some literary texts of the English syllabus encourage students to raise their voice against stereotypical mindset of the society.

Human Values: The curriculum reflects issues related to human values like justice and equality, liberty, discrimination, culture, tolerance towards racial diversity, etc., especially in some core and elective papers of Assamese, Education and English. The issues related to human rights, duties and obligations of citizens, etc. are ingrained in some papers of Political Science.

Environment and Sustainability: A compulsory course on "Environmental studies" is offered in second semester to all undergraduate students to develop awareness about environmental issues and concerns. Some papers offered by department of Botany like "Plant Ecology and phytogeography", "Plant Ecology, Environment and Resource Management", etc. focus on symbiotic relationship between human being and nature.

At the departmental level, a comprehensive approach is adopted to assess students' learning levels, ensuring their performance and the curriculum's effectiveness are thoroughly evaluated. Based on these varied criteria, students are categorized as advanced or slow learners. To support slow learners, the department organizes tutorial and remedial sessions, providing personalized guidance and a paced learning environment. Meanwhile, advanced learners are encouraged to explore topics beyond the prescribed syllabus. The peer-teaching method is utilized to foster collaborative learning and communication among students. Additionally, advanced learners are urged to engage in internships and training programs whenever possible, enriching their academic knowledge with practical experiences.

Tutorial sessions focus on developing problem-solving abilities rather than solely emphasizing theoretical knowledge, equipping students for the demands of the professional world.

To expand students' horizons, activities such as field trips, industry or research lab visits, museum tours, and expert lectures are incorporated, exposing them to diverse opportunities and career pathways. Additionally, extracurricular programs like group discussions, quizzes, debates, seminars, and industry training are actively encouraged to support well-rounded development. Some departments have also introduced small scholarship programs to assist exceptional students in pursuing their academic aspirations.

The internal assessment mechanism at our college is designed to be transparent and robust, ensuring regular and diverse evaluation methods. As an institution affiliated with Gauhati University, we strictly adhere to its guidelines. Mid-term sessional examinations are conducted each semester, with faculty members responsible for setting the papers and administering the tests. The cumulative performance in these assessments is considered when assigning internal assessment scores, which contribute to the final grades. 2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The mechanism for addressing internal examination-related grievances at our college is designed to be transparent, time-bound, and efficient. Students can raise their concerns through a well-defined process that ensures their issues are resolved promptly and fairly. The Examination Branch of the college, comprising faculty members and administrative staff, oversees this process.

Upon receiving a grievance, the Examination Branch reviews the complaint and initiates an investigation. Students are informed of the progress and expected resolution timeline. Common grievances include discrepancies in marks, errors in grade sheets, and issues with re-evaluation requests. To ensure transparency, students are allowed to view their evaluated answer sheets and discuss their concerns with the respective faculty members. If a resolution is not reached at this level, the matter is escalated to the Department Head or Examination Branch for further review.

The entire process is designed to be completed within a stipulated timeframe, ensuring that students' academic progress is not hindered. Additionally, any errors in communication or internal score discrepancies are promptly addressed in collaboration with the Gauhati University Examination Branch.

This structured approach ensures that all grievances are handled efficiently, maintaining the integrity and fairness of the internal assessment system.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

North Gauhati College is equipped with modern facilities to support the teaching and learning process. Both students and faculty are encouraged to leverage technological advancements for enhanced learning experiences. The implementation of smart classrooms has significantly improved the educational process. Several classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors connected to laptops with LAN access, and faculty actively incorporate these resources in their lessons.

The college's previous auditorium, with a seating capacity of 300, was demolished to make way for the construction of a new four-story building. In its place, a seminar hall with a 100-seat capacity and a conference hall that accommodates more than 50 people have been established, enabling the college to run parallel sessions for various activities.

As one of the oldest and most prestigious colleges on the northern bank of the Brahmaputra River, we have developed modern laboratories to cater to the growing demand for high-quality education. The college offers both Science and Arts streams, along with a B.Voc stream focused on skill-oriented vocational courses, such as Tourism and Hospitality Management. Upon completing these courses, students are successfully placed in various government, semi-government, and private sector jobs.

Cultural activities are a regular feature at North Gauhati College, with students actively participating in a variety of programs such as singing, dancing, one-act plays, mime performances, and more. Following the demolition of the auditorium in December 2024 for the construction of a new four-story

building, the college has temporarily adapted by using two large rooms, RCC1 and RCC2, for cultural events. Additionally, an open stage located at the northeast corner of the field is used for performances by both the college community and local residents of North Guwahati.

Games and Sports: The college has a UGC-funded indoor stadium, which hosts a variety of sports activities and competitions. It also has a volleyball court, a kabaddi court, and a shared football and cricket ground. Two faculties are assigned the responsibility for indoor and the outdoor games.

Yoga Centre: The college has a dedicated yoga centre where students can engage in yoga and meditation. In observance of International Yoga Day on June 21st, the college organizes an awareness program. Building on previous years' efforts, the Yoga Cell hosts an offline session led by a yoga expert to benefit the college community.

Dedicated bins are provided to ensure the separation of solid waste at its source. To minimize paper-based waste, paperless approach by digitizing most office procedures through electronic platforms such as WhatsApp and email. Biodegradable waste such as food scraps, garden waste, and cow dung is gathered and utilized for vermicomposting.

Liquid Waste Management:

The wastewater undergoes regular testing for specific characteristics like Total Dissolved Solids (TDS), pH levels, color, and hardness through a Green Audit.

Biomedical Waste Management:

Proper disposal methods are employed for items like sanitary napkins, used bandages, etc which are placed in designated bins.

E-waste Management:

Electronic waste components, like computer system elements, are utilized for practical demonstrations in student learning. E-waste equipment that cannot be recycled is collected, stored, and disposed of on an annual basis. Reusable electronic components such as resistors, capacitors, inductors, are employed by students in their projects.

Waste Recycling System:

Paper waste is sold to authorized vendors on a monthly basis for recycling in the paper industry. Vermicomposting is utilized to recycle solid waste, including kitchen and food waste, as well as organic waste. Food leftovers are provided to cattle and other animals.

Hazardous Chemicals and Radioactive Waste Management:

Chemical waste mixtures generated in the Chemistry laboratory, such as heavy metal solutions, corrosive liquids, and organic solvents, are carefully managed and directed to designated low-lying areas for safe containment
