

Educational Trip to Shillong-Cherrapunji, Meghalaya from 18/10/2018 to 20/10/2018

The educational trip to Shillong-Cherrapunji, Meghalaya, was arranged for the 1st semester (Major) students. The trip aimed to provide students with an enriching learning experience, allowing them to explore the natural beauty, ecological, and geographical significance of the region. The trip exemplified the department's commitment to holistic education and experiential learning, leaving a lasting impact on all who participated.

The trip commenced from the institution at 6.30 AM with a visit to Shillong Peak, where students explored the waterfalls and cultural attractions. The journey continued to Cherrapunji, renowned as one of the wettest places on Earth. Here, students marveled at the breathtaking landscapes, lush greenery, and cascading waterfalls. A caving expedition allowed students to explore the intricate network of limestone caves in the region, including the famous Mawsmai Cave. The journey was then made back to Shillong, the capital city of Meghalaya, where students had the opportunity to explore local markets. A stay over at Youth Hostel, Shillong was arranged for the night.

The second day journey started from the youth hostel to explore the Elephant falls, where students had a mesmerizing view of the waterfalls, and also later spent a leisure time in boating at Wards Lake.

The trip was journeyed back to North Gauhati College. On the way back, a stoppage was made at the Experimental Garden, Barapani. Here, students explored the various endemic plant species of the region.
